Where are they now?

Nick Ternette - 1963-'64

Nick Ternette is a social and political activist who has devoted the last 40 years of his life to various communities speaking out on social and political issues. He has combined the insight gained through his daily contact with residents, with political involvement, and with the media, to bring about social change.

Nick was born in West Berlin, Germany of Russian parents. He came to Canada at the age of 10. After attending Daniel McIntyre he became involved in activism during his early university days (University of Winnipeg - then United College) in 1965, when he demonstrated for freedom of speech. He graduated from United College in 1967 and began working with the Red Power Native organizations in Winnipeg.

He joined the World Council of Churches as a youth worker in West Berlin in 1967 and participated in the Union of Democratic Forces (SDS) of West Germany during the 1967-68 West German "democratization" period. He was in Prague just before the uprising against the Soviet Union's invasion of Czechoslovakia.

On his return to Canada, he worked as a paid organizer for the Vietnam Mobilization Committee and remained on the committee until 1975. He joined the Company of Young Canadians working on high school

education issues. Nick was also active in the New Democratic Youth from 1968 to 1971, and joined the left-wing Nationalist Waffle Group during 1970-72. He remained in the NDP as a left-wing critic and ran for the presidency of the Manitoba NDP 10 times. He challenged Howard Pawley for the leadership in 1979.

Nick left to work in Calgary in the early 1980s where he ran for city council and joined the NDP until his return to Winnipeg in 1985. During the 1980s he helped found the Green Movement in Winnipeg.

During his career as a political activist, Nick has run 20 different civic election campaigns in Winnipeg and Calgary. He has run for mayor five times, 13 times for city council, and twice for school trustee. He has attended countless peace walks and demonstrations, and has been arrested (but not convicted!) three times. Nick fought a 10 year battle (and won!) to obtain his confidential files from the Canadian Secret Intelligence Service (CSIS).

Nick has done freelance writing and broadcasting for various media, including newspaper, radio, and television. Currently, he is a regular freelance writer for Winnipeg's *Uptown Magazine* and the *Winnipeg Free Press*. Although semi-retired Nick is still involved in civic politics, the peace and labour (May Day) movements.

Nick married Emily in 1993 and they are proud grandparents to Simon, aged 4, Colin, aged 6, Bruce, aged 7, and Paris, 4 months.

Allen Rae - 1951

Allen attended Daniel Mac in 1948-51. In a recent letter he recalls winning the City High School Senior basketball title in 1950-51 but losing to St. Paul's for the Provincial title. On September 12, 2007 in Madrid, Spain Allen had the honour of being inducted in the International Basketball Hall of Fame (FIBA), in the referee (technical official) category.

A basketball referee since the 1950s, Allen refereed in four Olympic Games (Tokyo '64, Mexico '68, Munich '72 and Montreal '76) and called three Olympic semi-finals. He also officiated in many other international tournaments and championships including the Pan Am Games, the World University Games, Asian Games and the final of the 1975 European Championship for Men in Belgrade.

In a *Winnipeg Free Press* article from September 2007 about his hall of fame induction, Allen listed the Munich Olympics as his biggest thrill, "just because of the magnitude of it all." Allen also served as an RCMP officer. He now lives in Ottawa, Ontario.

Connie (Skrepnek) McCormick - 1964-'68

After attending DMCI, Connie worked alongside many other Danielites for two years at Red River Co-op at Ellice and Wall. Then she joined Air Canada and worked for 26 great years, based in Winnipeg. After one year as a stewardess/flight attendant she became a purser or in charge flight attendant. During that time she enjoyed greeting many DMCI teachers and alumni on her flights.

She loved to spend vacations in Africa, Asia, South America and many other parts of the world. Upon taking an early retirement, she and her husband now spend winters in Florida and Thailand and summers in Manitoba. They continue to explore new places as well. They have met many Danielites in their travels. So far, Connie has visited 96 countries.

She has maintained friendships with some of her fellow students and teachers. She extends a greeting to all.
